I want to straighten out the misunderstanding that many people have had regarding death. I want to enlighten you and bring you to the truth. Many have believed that death, in taking loved ones, was an agent of 'God', that God sent death to take a provider of bread away from a family, or a beloved wife from her husband. I want to show you from the Bible that this impression is wrong.

Some people believe the Bible is the word of men because men wrote it. If you read the Bible carefully, you can see it is not the word of men for it is not in accord with the spirit of men. Is it the spirit of men to turn the other cheek? Yet the Bible says: "... whosoever shall smite thee on thy right cheek, turn to him the other also." St. Matthew 5:39. Are these the words of men --- "Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest?" St. Matthew 11:28 Do men invite people to bring their troubles to them? The Bible is the Word of God, written by men inspired by the Spirit of God, men to whom God revealed His truth.

Let us read I Corinthians 15:24-26 as follows: "Then cometh the end, when he shall have delivered up the kingdom to God, even the Father; when he shall have put down all rule and all authority and power. For he must reign till he hath put all enemies under his feet. The last enemy that shall be destroyed is death."

Jesus now sits at the right hand of God and will be there until every enemy is subdued. When death is destroyed, then the last enemy will have been conquered.

In Hosea 13:14 we find these words: "I will ransom them from the power of the grave; I will redeem them from death: O death, I will be thy plaques; O grave, I will be thy destruction: repentance shall be hid from mine eyes."

God speaks here and says that He'll ransom those who put their trust in Him. Is that the language of man? Can man redeem from death? No, none but God.

GOD IS NOT A DESTROYER

Some have asked, why not take some worthless person if death must come? Some such would be better off dead and surely the world would be better off without worthless folks who do nothing to aid in the progress and development of the world. But I say unto you, that God is not a destroyer, but a Savior, a giver of life. God loves the world. Can you destroy that which you love? He so loved the world that He gave His only begotten son that whosoever believeth on Him should not perish but have everlasting life. See St. John 3:16.

In I John 4:7-8 we get a picture of God. Read: "Beloved, let us love one another: for love is of God; and every one that loveth is born of God, and knoweth God. He that loveth not knoweth not God; for God is love."

If you see anyone who does not love, he is not of God. You should even love your enemies. I can't see how a man can love a woman and then shoot her. I can't see how a man can love a woman and then beat her. It just doesn't fit in. Anything you love you'll pet. Far be it from you to kill that which you love.

It is not God Who destroys man. It is man's sins. Let a man drink when God says no drunkard can have eternal life. If a man will choose to drink, it is not God's fault because he dies. If he would avoid death, he should not drink. It is the thing you do that destroys you. When God made the penalty of death it wasn't because He intended to send man to hell, but because He wanted to test man's devotion for Him. And besides, you don't want the company of a drunkard. How could God stand one in heaven? We don't even want them in Washington.

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Follow men who follow God. When they step out of line, you keep on following God.

You cannot fool God's people; they know when you know God.

Those who do deeds of kindness will never be forgotten.

Unless your foundation is sound, it won't stand---build on God.

Don't turn your back on Jesus to be anybody's friend.

When you have given yourself to God, don't take yourself back.

If He gave His Son to save you, why wouldn't He give other things to encourage you?

When you give freely to God, you give more than the one who gives grudgingly, in spite of the amount.

Let us suppose you have several bottles on the shelf of your medicine cabinet and in the midst of them you have a bottle of iodine. Your little child has access to this cabinet. You would warn the child by saying, "Dear, don't touch that bottle in the middle with the skull and two bones on it because in the day you drink it you shall surely die." Now suppose the child should move all the other bottles aside and drink the iodine and die! You would not be at fault because you surely warned it.

MAN PICKS HIS OWN FATE

God created man with the freedom of will and He won't take that away. He has given man a nose, eyes, etc., to be used for his comfort and convenience. God won't take them away from him as members of his body even through man abuses them. He is not like man to take away or change around at every whim. He tells you before hand, if you do certain things what you must expect as a consequence. If you do them, what He has said will happen and it is your fault, not His. He has arranged His plan in wisdom and the foundation of it is life, eternal life.

Now we'll see how death came, Read Romans 5:12 as follows: "Wherefore, as by one man, sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned."

We see that the sentence of death was passed because of sin. While we did not participate in the first sin, we were in the loins of Adam who did sin, and thereby we became subject to death through Adam's transgression. Sin entered through one man and by one man it shall be carried away.

Man brings death through his sins. Lucifer was driven from heaven because his heart was lifted up and he had grown rebellious. Read Ezekiel 28:14-17 as follows. "Thou art the anointed cherub that covereth; and I have set thee so: thou wast upon the holy mountain of God; thou has walked up and down in the midst of the stones of fire. Thou wast perfect in thy ways from the day that thou wast created, till iniquity was found in thee. By the multitude of thy merchandise, they have filled the midst of thee with violence, and thou hast sinned: therefore, will I cast thee as profane out of the mountain of God: and I will destroy thee, O covering cherub, from the midst of the stones of fire. Thine heart was lifted up because of thy beauty, thou has corrupted thy wisdom by reason of thy brightness: I will cast thee to the ground, I will lay thee before kings, that they may behold thee."

Man was driven from the Garden of Eden because God feared that he would put forth his hand and eat of the fruit of the tree of life. If this had happened, he wouldn't have died according to the Word of God. The devil was cast out of heaven into the earth. Someone said the devil was in hell; he is in Washington. Read Revelation

12:9-13 as follows: "And the great dragon was cast out, that old serpent, called the Devil, and Satan, which deceiveth the whole world: he was cast into the earth, and his angels were cast out with him ... he persecuted the woman which brought forth the man child."

He started on Eve, and he's been working on women ever since.

DEVIL REACHES WOMAN THROUGH HER PET

Read Genesis 3:1-7 as follows: "Now the serpent was more subtil than any beast of the field which the Lord God had made. And he said unto the woman, Yea, hath God said, Ye shall not eat of every tree of the garden? And the woman said unto the serpent, We may eat of the fruit of the trees of the garden: But of the fruit of the tree which is in the midst of the garden, God hath said, Ye shall not eat of it, neither shall ye touch it, lest ye die. And the serpent said unto the woman, Ye shall not surely die: ... For God doth know that in the day ye eat thereof, then your eyes shall be opened, and ye shall be as gods, knowing good and evil.

And when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree to be desired to make one wise, she took of the fruit thereof, and did eat, and gave also unto her husband with her: And he did eat. ... And the eyes of them both were opened, and they knew that they were naked. And they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves aprons."

The serpent was Eve's pet. The devil can easily reach you by getting in your pet. His spirit got into the woman's pet and spoke to her through it. He never comes in the form of the devil, such as man pictures him with a long red tail and two horns in his head and a pitch fork in his hand. He'd probably frighten you away from him if he did. He comes like a friend,,,, in the form of a friend, with the voice of a friend, and the attention and sympathy and interest of a friend. Eve's

pet was close to her. Therefore, he could get close to her through it.

In those days animals spoke. It wasn't strange to hear them. At our own zoo, there is a crow that talks. And we know of the parrot's speaking ability. Eve listened to the serpent, her pet, as it talked to persuade her. It told her that the fruit would make her wise as gods and if a woman believes that anything will make her wise, she'll want it. Her curiosity is easily aroused and when once it is aroused, she is going to find out what she wants to know. You bring a package home and give it to her saying: "Now, Darling, keep this for me until I come back at noon, but DON'T OPEN IT!". She'll lock it up because you told her to take care of it. But at eleven o'clock she'll get it again and feel it and ask the question again, "I wonder what is in that package." Then she'll pinch a piece of the wrapper and find that there is another wrapper under the first. Then she'll say, "I don't care what he says, I'm going to find out what is in this package." This is due to her curiosity.

HELL CREATED FOR SPIRITS, NOT MAN: SO, MAN'S REDEMPTION IS PROVIDED FOR

God put the forbidden tree there to test man's fidelity. He wanted man to live, but He wanted him to prove himself deserving of God's favor by being absolutely true to God through his own will.

Angels are spirit beings who are not subject to death as man is. Hell which shall be formed in the earth was conceived for spirits, not for man. Man becoming subject to death was driven out of the Garden so he could not put forth his hand and eat of the tree of life and life after he had been condemned to die.

When Lucifer, who was familiar with God's plan concerning the creation because he had been in the secret council with God when they agreed to make man, saw that man had been man, he set to work to lead him wrong so as to bring him into condemnation and thereby interfere with God's aim to give man eternal life.

The devil rules the earth. He is prince of the air. He has pretty much his own way in the earth. Man was subject to death after the devil took advantage of him and made him sin. Nevertheless, God worked out a plan to redeem him. Read Romans 5:17 as follows: "For if by one man's offense death reigned by one; much more they which receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness shall reign in life by one, Jesus Christ.) Therefore as by the offense of one judgment came upon all men to condemnation; even so by the righteousness of one the free gift came upon all men unto justification of life. For as by one man's disobedience many were made sinners, so by the obedience of one shall many be made righteous."

One man brought death into the

world. By one life came. In Hebrews 2:9-14 we find these words: "But we see Jesus who was made a little lower than the angels for the suffering of death, crowned with glory and honour; that he by the grace of God should taste death for every man. For it became him, for whom are all things, and by whom are all things, in bringing many sons unto glory, to make the captain of their salvation perfect through sufferings. For both he that sanctifieth and they who are sanctified are all of one: For which cause he is not ashamed to call them brethren. Saying, I will declare thy name unto my brethren, in the midst of the church will I sing praise unto thee. And again, Behold I and the children which God hath given me. Forasmuch then as the children are partakers of flesh and blood, he also himself likewise took part of the same; that through death he might destroy him that had the power of death, that is, the devil."

THROUGH CHRIST, MAN MAY NOW LIVE

As angels can't be subject to death, as has been pointed out, Christ was made a man that He might be subject to all things as man is, and yet not be a part thereof. THE SPRING 2022 - SOLEMN ASSEMBLY

Fasting is a vital aspect of true worship. It is not a time for feasting, fun, pious acting, or bowing to one's self to appear sanctimonious. The period of Prayer, Meditation, Worship and Fasting represents serious time spent with the Lord. During this time of consecration, the Believer afflicts the body while seeking to gain strength for the inner man.

From Friday, April 7th through Sunday, April 16, 2023, Gospel Spreading Church engages in a Solemn Assembly. COVID-19 guidelines suggest radical change in corporate worship. Modern technology such as webinars and smart phones replace regular church gatherings. Gospel Spreading Church members presently engage in the worship experience while sheltering in place.

Praise God for His faithfulness. In life we sometimes find ourselves in difficulties that help us recognize the fact that we need God to work out our situations. Problems are no strangers to us. Life's situations are not always understood and may be very hard to unravel.

In Bible days, when people of God found themselves facing insurmountable odds, they called on God. For example, Queen Esther called the people to prayer and fasting (See Esther 4:16). The city of Nineveh was called to fasting and prayer (See Jonah 3:5). When the disciples were unable to cast demons out of the child, Jesus informed them of the necessity of prayer and fasting. "Howbeit this kind goeth not out but by prayer and fasting" (St. Matthew 17:21).

The procedure for corporate prayer and fasting is outlined in Joel 2:15-17. In these worship services every detail is given. Everyone from the greatest to the least is to be accounted for. The people are gathered, the congregation is to be cleansed/sanctified. The elders, children, nursing babies, bride, bridegroom, priests, ministers of the Lord are to be assembled. No one is left out.

Just as the prophet Joel explains corporate prayer and fasting, the prophet Isaiah exhorts the church to fast individually. "Is not this the fast that I have chosen? to loose the bands of wickedness, to undo the heavy burdens, and to let the oppressed go free, and that ye break every yoke? Is it not to deal thy bread to the hungry, and that thou bring the poor that are cast out to thy house? when thou seest the naked, that thou cover him; and that thou hide not thyself from thine own flesh" (Isaiah 58:6,7)?

Corporate and individual prayer and fasting are often major factors in true worship. We receive great things from the Lord when we obey His instructions regarding how to worship. "Then shall thy light break forth as the morning, and thine health shall spring forth speedily: and thy righteousness shall go before thee; the glory of the LORD shall be thy rereward" (Isaiah 58:8).

Just as prayer and fasting were practices in the Old Testament, and the New Testament, they are important elements in worshiping God in this 21st century. Isaiah truly cried aloud and spared not. He declared unto us what is the acceptable fast unto the Lord. We should not withhold good when we have such an opportunity.

Jesus taught His followers how to conduct themselves when in prayer and fasting. He said, "But thou, when thou fastest, anoint thine head, and wash thy face; That thou appear not unto men to fast, but unto thy Father which is in secret: and thy Father, which seeth in secret, shall reward thee openly" (St. Matthew 6:17, 18).

We also follow the exhortation found in I Timothy 2:1-4: "I EXHORT therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks, be made for all men; For kings, and for all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty. For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior; Who will have all men to be saved, and to come unto the knowledge of the truth." In this regard, during the solemn assembly, special prayers are offered for the President of the United States, his staff, members of the U.S. Congress, judges of the earth and the Armed Forces. Second Chronicles 7:14: "If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land." As a nation, and as individuals, we need to turn from our wicked ways. If this is done, God will heal our land.

We are living in a time of trouble, such as never was since there has been a nation. However, we can always find comfort in the Scriptures. Psalm 84:11: "For the LORD God is a sun and shield: the LORD will give grace and glory: no good thing will he withhold from them that walk uprightly. Regardless of the circumstances, God will honor His Word, if we will obey Him to the letter. "For all the promises of God in him are yea, and in him Amen, unto the **glory of God by us**" (II Corinthians 1:20).

God is the LORD, which hath shewed us light: bind the sacrifice with cords, even unto the horns of the altar. Thou art my God, and I will praise thee: thou art my God, I will exalt thee. O give thanks unto the LORD; for he is good: for his mercy endureth forever."

Prayers, praises and professions of obedience are found in Psalm 119, verses 1-16. "BLESSED are the undefiled in the way, who walk in the law of the LORD. Blessed are they that keep his testimonies, and that seek him with the whole heart. They also do no iniquity: they walk in his ways. Thou hast commanded us to keep thy precepts diligently. O that my ways were directed to keep thy statutes! Then shall I not be ashamed, when I have respect unto all thy commandments. I will praise thee with uprightness of heart, when I shall have learned thy righteous judgments. I will keep thy statutes: O forsake me not utterly. Wherewithal shall a young man cleanse his way? by taking heed thereto according to thy word. With my whole heart have I sought thee: O let me not wander from thy commandments. Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee. Blessed art thou, O LORD: teach me thy statutes. With my lips have I declared all the judgments of thy mouth. I have rejoiced in the way of thy testimonies, as much as in all riches. I will meditate in thy precepts, and have respect unto thy ways. I will delight myself in thy statutes: ... I will not forget thy word."



"And the angel answered and said unto the women, Fear not ye: for I know that ye seek Jesus, which was crucified. He is not here: for he is risen, as he said. Come, see the place where the Lord lay (St. Matthew 28: 5-6)."

Christians recognize **Good Friday** as the day Jesus was crucified. At sundown, Jesus' dead body was taken down from the cross, wrapped in new cloth, and placed in a borrowed tomb that was sealed and guarded by a group of Roman soldiers. Three days later, **Easter Sunday** morning, He arose from the dead. "**Come, see**" was an angel's invitation (St. Matthew 28:6) at the grave. That morning, an angel had already "**rolled back the stone from the door**" (v. 2) of the tomb, not to let Christ out, but to let the world in to see the empty tomb.

Today, the invitation for the resurrection is the same, "Come, see." Come, see the miracle, power, and truth of Christ's resurrection, *and believe it*. Christ's resurrection demonstrated that He paid the price for all our sins at the Cross (See Romans 4:25). The work of salvation is complete! If you trust that Christ died for your sins and rose again, then you are saved from all your sins and have the gift of eternal life (See I Corinthians 5:3-4; Romans 6:23; Ephesians 1:13; 2:8-9). Amen! Amen!



LESSON 14 – April 2, 2023 SUBJECT: Crucified for Sinners

GOLDEN TEXT: "And we have seen and do testify that the Father sent the Son to be the Saviour of the world" (1 John 4:14).

PRINTED TEXT: St. Matthew 27:38 Then were there two thieves crucified with him, one on the right hand, and another on the left.

39 And they that passed by reviled him, wagging their heads,

- 40 And saying, Thou that destroyest the temple, and buildest it in three days, save thyself. If thou be the Son of God, come down from the cross.
- 41 Likewise also the chief priests mocking him, with the scribes and elders, said,
- 42 He saved others; himself he cannot save. If he be the King of Israel, let him now come down from the cross, and we will believe him.
- 43 He trusted in God; let him deliver him now, if he will have him: for he said, I am the Son of God.
- 44 The thieves also, which were crucified with him, cast the same in his teeth
- 45 Now from the sixth hour there was darkness over all the land unto the ninth hour.
- 46 And about the ninth hour Jesus cried with a loud voice, saying, Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani? that is to say, My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken
- 47 Some of them that stood there, when they heard that, said, This man calleth for Elias.
- 48 And straightway one of them ran, and took a spunge, and filled it with vinegar, and put it on a reed, and gave him to drink.
- **49** The rest said, Let be, let us see whether Elias will come to save him. 50 Jesus, when he had cried again with a loud voice, yielded up the ghost.
- 51 And, behold, the veil of the temple was rent in twain from the top to the bottom; and the earth did quake, and the rocks rent;
- 52 And the graves were opened; and many bodies of the saints which slept arose,
- 53 And came out of the graves after his resurrection, and went into the holy city, and appeared unto many.
- 54 Now when the centurion, and they that were with him, watching Jesus, saw the earthquake, and those things that were done, they feared greatly, saying, Truly this was the Son of God

LESSON DISCUSSION

St. Matthew 27:38 - 54 describes the crucifixion of Jesus Christ, which is a significant event. The passage begins by stating that two robbers were also crucified alongside Jesus. The soldiers then placed the sign above Jesus' head that read "This is Jesus, the King of the Jews." The chief priest and scribes, along with the crowd, mocked and taunted Jesus. They challenged Him to save Himself if He truly were the Son of God.

At noon, darkness fell upon the land lasting for three hours, and Jesus cried out "... Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani? that is to say, My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me? This utterance fulfilled Psalm 22:1 and showed Jesus' humanity as He experienced the pain of separation from His Father. Some of the bystanders misunderstood and thought He was calling for Elijah. Jesus cried out with a loud voice and said, "It is finished:" St. John 19:30. He then breathed His last breath.

At that moment, the curtain of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom. Clearly, God did the tearing. This action symbolized the end of the separation between God and man. The earth shook, rocks split, and tombs were open. Many bodies of holy people who had died were raised to life. The centurion in charge of Jesus' crucifixion, upon witnessing all these events declared Jesus was indeed the Son of God.

LESSON 15 – April 9, 2023 SUBJECT: Risen from the Dead

GOLDEN TEXT: "Then the same day at evening, being the first day of the week, when the doors were shut where the disciples were assembled for fear of the Jews, came Jesus and stood in the midst, and saith unto them, Peace be unto you" (St. John 20:19).

PRINTED TEXT: St. John 20:1 The first day of the week cometh Mary Magdalene early, when it was yet dark, unto the sepulchre, and seeth the stone taken away from the sepulchre.

- 2 Then she runneth, and cometh to Simon Peter, and to the other disciple, whom Jesus loved, and saith unto them, They have taken away the LORD out of the sepulchre, and we know not where they have laid him.
- 3 Peter therefore went forth, and that other disciple, and came to the sepulchre.
- 4 So they ran both together: and the other disciple did outrun Peter, and came first to the sepulchre.
- 5 And he stooping down, and looking in, saw the linen clothes lying; yet went he not in.
- 6 Then cometh Simon Peter following him, and went into the sepulchre, and seeth the linen clothes lie,
- 7 And the napkin, that was about his head, not lying with the linen clothes, but wrapped together in a place by itself.
- 8 Then went in also that other disciple, which came first to the sepulchre, and he saw, and believed.
- 9 For as yet they knew not the scripture, that he must rise again from the dead.
- 10 Then the disciples went away again unto their own home.
- 11 But Mary stood without at the sepulchre weeping: and as she wept, she stooped down, and looked into the sepulchre,
- 12 And seeth two angels in white sitting, the one at the head, and the other at the feet, where the body of Jesus had lain.
- 13 And they say unto her, Woman, why weepest thou? She saith unto them, Because they have taken away my LORD, and I know not where they have laid him.
- 14 And when she had thus said, she turned herself back, and saw Jesus standing, and knew not that it was Jesus.
- 15 Jesus saith unto her, Woman, why weepest thou? whom seekest thou? She, supposing him to be the gardener, saith unto him, Sir, if thou have borne him hence, tell me where thou hast laid him, and I will take him away.
- 16 Jesus saith unto her, Mary. She turned herself, and saith unto him, Rabboni; which is to say, Master.
- 17 Jesus saith unto her, Touch me not; for I am not yet ascended to my Father: but go to my brethren, and say unto them, I ascend unto my Father, and your Father; and to my God, and your God.
- 18 Mary Magdalene came and told the disciples that she had seen the LORD, and that he had spoken these things unto her.
- 19 Then the same day at evening, being the first day of the week, when the doors were shut where the disciples were assembled for fear of the Jews, came Jesus and stood in the midst, and saith unto them, Peace be unto you.
- 20 And when he had so said, he shewed unto them his hands and his side. Then were the disciples glad, when they saw the LORD.

LESSON DISCUSSION

The events of Jesus' resurrection and the reactions of His disciples are discussed in John 20:1-10; 19-20. Mary Magdalene arrived at the tomb early in the morning to find the stone had been removed from the entrance. The tomb was empty. Mary ran to tell Peter and John, who then ran to the tomb to see for themselves. They found the burial clothes, including the cloth that had covered Jesus' head. The cloth was folded neatly and placed separately from the other linen.

Later that evening, Jesus appeared to the disciples, who were gathered in a locked room for fear of the Jews. Jesus greeted them with the words, "Peace be with you," St. John 20:19b, he then showed them His hands and side. The disciples rejoiced upon seeing the Lord. Thomas, who was not present at that time, doubted the testimony of the resurrection. When Jesus appeared to Thomas, He invited him to touch His wounds. After that experience, Thomas believed.

The disciples rejoiced upon seeing the Lord, and Jesus commissioned them to go and spread the news of His resurrection. This passage highlights the significance of the disciples' commission to spread the news of Jesus' resurrection. This has been carried on by believers throughout history.

LESSON 16 – April 16, 2023 SUBJECT: Proofs of the Resurrection

GOLDEN TEXT: "And he said unto them, These are the words which I spake unto you, while I was yet with you, that all things must be fulfilled, which were written in the law of Moses, and in the prophets, and in the psalms, concerning me" (St. Luke 24:44).

PRINTED TEXT: St. Luke 24:36 And as they thus spake, Jesus himself stood in the midst of them, and saith unto them, Peace be unto you.

37 But they were terrified and affrighted, and supposed that they had seen a spirit.

38 And he said unto them, Why are ye troubled? and why do thoughts arise in your hearts?

39 Behold my hands and my feet, that it is I myself: handle me, and see; for a spirit hath not flesh and bones, as ye see me have.

for a spirit hath not flesh and bones, as ye see me have.
40 And when he had thus spoken, he shewed them his hands and his feet.

41 And while they yet believed not for joy, and wondered, he said unto them, Have ye here any meat?

42And they gave him a piece of a broiled fish, and of an honeycomb.

43 And he took it, and did eat before them.

44 And he said unto them, These are the words which I spake unto you, while I was yet with you, that all things must be fulfilled, which were written in the law of Moses, and in the prophets, and in the psalms, concerning me.

45 Then opened he their understanding, that they might understand the scriptures,

46 And said unto them, Thus it is written, and thus it behooved Christ to suffer, and to rise from the dead the third day:

47 And that repentance and remission of sins should be preached in his name among all nations, beginning at Jerusalem.

48 And ye are witnesses of these things.

49 And, behold, I send the promise of my Father upon you: but tarry ye in the city of Jerusalem, until ye be endued with power from on high.

50 And he led them out as far as to Bethany, and he lifted up his hands, and blessed them.

51 And it came to pass, while he blessed them, he was parted from them, and carried up into heaven.

52 And they worshipped him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy:

53 And were continually in the temple, praising and blessing God. Amen.

LESSON DISCUSSION

This passage begins with Jesus entering the room where His disciples were gathered. He greeted them by saying, "Peace be with you." St. Luke 24:36b. The disciples were startled, thinking they were seeing a ghost. Jesus reassured them that He was alive and not a ghost. He showed them His hands, feet, and wounds from the crucifixion. He desired that know He was indeed the same Jesus Who had been crucified. He then ate fish in their presence to show that He was not a spirit, but has a physical body.

Jesus then led them out to Bethany where He blessed them, after which He was taken up into heaven. The disciples worshiped Him and returned to Jerusalem with great joy, continually praising God in the temple.

This experience highlights the mission of the disciples to proclaim the gospel and implies the need for repentance and forgiveness of sin. The ascension of Jesus into heaven marks the end of His earthly ministry and the beginning of the spread of the gospel message to all nations.

LESSON 17 – April 23, 2023 SUBJECT: The Bread of Life

GOLDEN TEXT: "And Jesus said unto them, I am the bread of life: he that cometh to me shall never hunger; and he that believeth on me shall never thirst" (St. John 6:35).

PRINTED TEXT: St. John 6:22 The day following, when the people which stood on the other side of the sea saw that there was none other boat there, save that one whereinto his disciples were entered, and that Jesus went not with his disciples into the boat, but that his disciples were gone away alone;

23 (Howbeit there came other boats from Tiberias nigh unto the place where they did eat bread, after that the Lord had given thanks:)

24 When the people therefore saw that Jesus was not there, neither his disciples, they also took shipping, and came to Capernaum, seeking for Jesus.

25 And when they had found him on the other side of the sea, they said unto him, Rabbi, when camest thou hither?

26 Jesus answered them and said, Verily, Verily, I say unto you, Ye seek me, not because ye saw the miracles, but because ye did eat of the loaves, and were filled.

27 Labour not for the meat which perisheth, but for that meat which endureth unto everlasting life, which the Son of man shall give unto you: for him hath God the Father sealed.

28 Then said they unto him, What shall we do, that we might work the works of God?

29 Jesus answered and said unto them, This is the work of God, that ye believe on him whom he hath sent.

30 They said therefore unto him, What sign shewest thou then, that we may see, and believe thee? what dost thou work?

31 Our fathers did eat manna in the desert; as it is written, He gave them bread from heaven to eat.

32 Then Jesus said unto them, Verily, Verily, I say unto you, Moses gave you not that bread from heaven; but my Father giveth you the true bread from heaven.

33 For the bread of God is he which cometh down from heaven, and giveth life unto the world.

34 Then said they unto him, Lord, evermore give us this bread.

35 And Jesus said unto them, I am the bread of life: he that cometh to me shall never hunger; and he that believeth on me shall never thirst.

LESSON DISCUSSION

This lesson recounts a conversation between Jesus and the crowd that had been miraculously fed with five loaves of bread and two fish. The crowd found Jesus on the other side of the sea and questioned Him about when He arrived. Jesus responded by telling them that they were seeking Him for the physical satisfaction of their hunger and engaged them to seek true nourishment that comes from believing in Him.

Jesus explained that He is the bread of life and whosoever comes to Him will never hunger or thirst again. He explained that as bread sustains physical life, He sustains eternal life. Jesus emphasized the importance of faith in Him saying that no one could come to Him unless granted by the Father. Jesus reminds the crowd that their physical needs are temporary. He offers a more lasting and meaningful sustenance. He explains that He has been sent by God to offer eternal life. And the way to receive it is to believe in Him. He alone can provide true fulfillment. St. John 6:22-35 is a powerful reminder of the centrality of faith in Jesus as the key to eternal life.

LESSON 18 – April 30, 2023 SUBJECT: The Light of the World

GOLDEN TEXT: "Then spake Jesus again unto them, saying, I am the light of the world: he that followeth me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life" (St. John 8:12).

PRINTED TEXT: St. John 8:12 Then spake Jesus again unto them, saying, I am the light of the world: he that followeth me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life.

13 The Pharisees therefore said unto him, Thou bearest record of thyself; thy record is not true.

14 Jesus answered and said unto them, Though I bear record of myself, yet my record is true: for I know whence I came, and whither I go; but ye cannot tell whence I come, and whither I go.

15 Ye judge after the flesh; I judge no man.

16 And yet if I judge, my judgment is true: for I am not alone, but I and the Father that sent me.

17 It is also written in your law, that the testimony of two men is true.

18 I am one that bear witness of myself, and the Father that sent me beareth witness of me.

19 Then said they unto him, Where is thy Father? Jesus answered, Ye neither know me, nor my Father: if ye had known me, ye should have known my Father also.

20 These words spake Jesus in the treasury, as he taught in the temple: and no man laid hands on him; for his hour was not yet come.

12:44 Jesus cried and said, He that believeth on me, believeth not on me, but on him that sent me.


45 And he that seeth me seeth him that sent me.

LESSON DISCUSSION

These passages emphasize Jesus as the light of the world. St. John 8:12, Jesus declares, "I am the light of the world. Whosoever follows Me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." He is speaking to a group of people who are questioning His authority. He uses the metaphor of light to illustrate the clarity and truth He brings to their lives. St. John 12:44-46, Jesus once again speaks of Himself as the light saying, "... He that believeth on me, believeth not on me, but on him that sent me. ... I am come a light into the world, that whosoever believeth on me, should not abide in darkness."

These passages highlight the importance of following Jesus and His teachings. They bring clarity and truth to our lives. They also emphasize the unity between Jesus and God the Father, illustrating the divine nature of Christ. The metaphor of light suggests that without Jesus, we are in darkness and lack direction. With Him, we have a clear path to follow. These passages affirm the centrality of Christ to the Christian faith and the importance of seeking His light in our lives. Those who follow Him will have access to eternal life.
