BAPTISM IS FOR THE RIGHTEOUS ONLY

If God gives a command and that command is not obeyed by you, then you become a sinner. You must obey the commandments of God line upon line. You can't do it your way, the way most convenient to you. So many people who are believed to be following Christ want to have their way. That is not the way to follow Christ. Everything He tells us to do, He tells us how to do it. The blessing comes in doing it like He tells us.

If you are willing to obey God, you'll make the effort though you may not have the capacity. And when He sees you have the will to do, He'll supply the ability and the strength. Many years ago, I couldn't see how a man could live in this world and not commit sin. It didn't seem possible that one could be perfect. But one day I heard His voice saying in St. Matthew 5:48: "Be ye therefore perfect, even as your Father which is in heaven is perfect." I believed it was possible and started out trying to obey. He supplied all the power and ability necessary, and then I became perfect. Every day I figure how to do what I have to do the right way. As I begin to figure, the Lord showed me how. Now it is easy. Now I would rather endure whatever it takes to treat you right than the eternal consequences of treating you wrong.

Living above sin is just doing that which is right. Don't conceive of any plan or program that would require you to do wrong in order to put it over. God says, whatever you lose in order to follow Him in righteousness, He'll make up to you in abundance. Joy, peace, and contentment are great rewards that no power, but God can supply; and these are freely given to those who live right. You'll have God to help you win when the devil is trying hard to subdue you. Anytime you obey God as He commands, you'll be a very happy man and woman.

God has given us a command regarding baptism which is very essential and must be obeyed. In I Corinthians 15:29 you'll find these words: "Else what shall they do which are baptized for the dead," I am ready like Phillip, the deacon of the early church, to help you complete your salvation: and it is not complete without baptism in accordance with the commandment of God. He didn't mean sprinkle. He didn't mean to have water poured on you. He meant to be buried under the water, in the water like Jesus was. He said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life." No man can get to the Father unless he follows the way I lead (See St. John 14:6). Baptism is one of the things you seem to feel is not essential. It carries with it a great meaning, a meaning which you are not able to understand or analyze. You are baptized for a purpose.

The command that God gave John was "Go and preach repentance to men" (St. Luke 24:47a). And when they show fruit indicating that they have repented, baptize them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost. This is essential because Jesus Who shall redeem men from their sins shall be buried and shall be raised again. So, their baptism will be a symbol of this burial and resurrection of Jesus, their Redeemer. When you are baptized, you commemorate the death and resurrection of Christ who endured this experience for your sins.

You are told in Romans 6:4 that you are not to be sprinkled, or wet by water poured from a vessel, but buried in baptism. "Therefore, we are buried with him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life."

BAPTISM IS FOR THE RIGHTEOUS ONLY

The symbol can only be carried out by burial in water whereby the entire body is submerged and brought to the surface again. So good folks, regardless to what you have been told, this is the only type of baptism that God recognizes. You are not obedient if you accept any other type. You are not in Christ if you accept any other. You are not doing right if you accept any other. As you are buried in the likeness of His death, you come forth out of the water in the likeness of His resurrection.

Your concern above everything should be to have spiritual life. All things you do are governed by the thoughts that enter your mind. I am, therefore, trying to get into your mind thoughts that will bring you peace, bring you joy, bring you happiness; give you understanding so that other things cannot upset you. I am trying to get you to place your mind on God to the extent that you will seek to obey His commandments and do that which is right in His sight. If you will receive my word and follow the teaching, He will deliver not only from the physical torments of life, but also from the eternal torments of the spiritual life.

The foundation of salvation is obedience to God. God has set forth instructions which we must follow to establish us as obedient children of God. Rules conducting the child of God over a definite course leading to complete salvation require that certain ordinances be observed. Whether we see the need of observing them or not, is not the basis of the requirement. It is not left to our judgment or opinion because it is God who has mapped out the plan of salvation and not us. The course He has set forth is necessary to restore us in His favor and meet the requirements of regeneration, just like the ritual that is set up in your lodge in order that one of the outside desiring to become a member might be initiated into the lodge.

Baptism was introduced by Christ as an essential ordinance by which you might be inducted into the channels of salvation to become a child of God. No one can be baptized in the name of Jesus unless he has first repented and forsaken his sins. Repenting doesn't mean crying. It means forsaking the sins. You are sorry for the sins you have committed in that you turn away from them and seek to live a righteous life only. Godly sorrow worketh repentance, which means you are sorry you

went contrary to the will of God, and ashamed of things you did in sin to the extent that you firmly resolve that if God forgives you and shows mercy in cleansing you from your unrighteousness, you will never again commit such acts. God being moved by such repentance, forgives you and clears up your record. Then you are ready for baptism.

God wanting you to be freed from the penalty and power of sin, sent His only begotten Son to die for you. The moment you could believe and see that disobedience to God is unprofitable here and damnable hereafter, you would become established in righteousness. You would then be buried with Christ in baptism in water and come up in the newness of life and live a life above sin, by following His precepts and obeying His teachings. You would let Christ be the example.

Read St. Matthew 3:5-7: "Then went out to him Jerusalem, and all Judea, and all the region round about Jordan, And were baptized of him in Jordan, confessing their sins. But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees come to his baptism, he said unto them, O generation of vipers, who hath warned you to flee from the wrath to come?"

I want you to notice the expression, "in Jordan." Today some ministers pour water on, some sprinkle; but those who were baptized by the messenger or minister sent by God, were taken into the water, and buried beneath the surface.

The Pharisees and Sadducees constituted the religious group in the day of Jesus. It was this bunch who associated to take counsel against

Jesus and planned the crucifixion of Christ. It wasn't sinners who did this. It was the church folks. It was folks who didn't want to be subject to the order of Heaven. They refused to be baptized according to the order of Heaven and came to the services only to mock and to laugh. John called them a generation of snakes. He said, though you are members of the church, you have not yet repented. You have not yet obeyed God. You are not yet prepared for salvation. You think that because you are the seed of Abraham, God will have respect for you in disobedience. But don't fool yourselves! For God is able of these stones to raise up a worthy seed unto Abraham who will be obedient to His word and acceptable in your stead.

This has brought a vivid lesson home to us. If you've got evil in your heart against your neighbor, if you regard iniquity in your heart, if you are not walking free from your sins, you go down in baptism a dry sinner and come up a wet one. Baptism is not intended for such. You have no business being buried with Christ in baptism until you have forsaken your sins.

"Bring forth therefore fruits meet for repentance: And think not to say within yourselves, We have Abraham to our father: for I say unto you, that God is able of these stones to raise up children unto Abraham. And now also the axe is laid unto the root of the trees: therefore, every tree which bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down and cast into the fire. I indeed baptize you with water unto repentance: but he that cometh after me is mightier than I, Whose shoes I am not worthy to bear: he shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost and with fire: whose fan is in his hand, and he will thoroughly purge his floor, and gather his wheat into the garner; but he will burn up the chaff with unquenchable fire" (St. Matthew 3:8-12).

Mrs. Michaux's Gospel Message to All

"How Shall We Escape If We Neglect So Great A Salvation?"

God has provided a way whereby we can be saved from His wrath, but how shall we escape if we neglect so great a Salvation?

He has made ample provision to save everyone. If we only accept His wonderful plan of salvation.

We were all born in sin through Adam's transgression in the Garden of Eden, but thanks be to God which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ, who redeemed us at a very costly price. This is made clear in the book of Isaiah. The exhortation to seek the Lord as recorded in Isaiah, Chapter 55, verses 1-13 says: "HO, every one that thirsteth, come ye to the waters, and he that hath no money; come ye, buy, and eat; yea, come, buy wine and milk without money and without price.

"Wherefore do ye spend money for that which is not bread? and your labour for that which satisfieth not? hearken diligently unto me, and eat ye that which is good, and let your soul delight itself in fatness.

"Incline your ear, and come unto me: hear, and your soul shall live; and I will make an everlasting covenant with you, even the sure mercies of David. Behold, I have given him for a witness to the people, a leader and commander to the people.

"Seek ye the LORD while he may be found, call ye upon him while he is near: Let the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts: and let him return unto the LORD, and he will have mercy upon him; and to our God, for he will abundantly pardon.

"For as the rain cometh down, and the snow from heaven, and returneth not thither, but watereth the earth, and maketh it bring forth and bud, that it may give seed to the sower, and bread to the eater: So shall my word be that goeth forth out of my mouth: it shall not return unto me void, but it shall accomplish that which I please, and it shall prosper in the thing whereto I sent it.

"For ye shall go out with joy, and be led forth with peace: the mountains and the hills shall break forth before you into singing, and all the trees of the field shall clap their hands. Instead of the thorn shall come up the fir tree, and instead of the brier shall come up the myrtle tree: and it shall be to the LORD for a name, for an everlasting sign that shall not be cut off."

My next thought is Jesus is the entire plan of salvation, our soon coming King, and He is made unto us wisdom, righteousness, sanctification and redemption, health, and strength. We find in Isaiah 53:5. "But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed."

In Acts the Third Chapter, verses 1-26 we find Jesus still working: "NOW Peter and John went up together into the temple at the hour of prayer, being the ninth hour.

"And a certain man lame from his mother's womb was carried, whom they laid daily at the gate of the temple which is called Beautiful, to ask alms of them that entered into the temple; Who seeing Peter and John about to go into the temple asked an alms. And Peter, fastening his eyes upon him with John, said, Look on us.

"And he gave heed unto them, expecting to receive something of them.

"Then Peter said, Silver and gold have I none; but such as I

have give I thee: In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth rise up and walk. And he took him by the right hand and lifted him up: and immediately his feet and ancle bones received strength.

"And he leaping up stood, and walked, and entered with them into the temple, walking, and leaping, and praising God. And all the people saw him walking and praising God: And they knew that it was he which sat for alms at the Beautiful gate of the temple: and they were filled with wonder and amazement at that which had happened unto him.

"And as the lame man which was healed held Peter and John, all the people ran together unto them in the porch that is called Solomon's greatly wondering. And when Peter saw it, he answered unto the people, Ye men of Israel, why marvel ye at this? or why look ye so earnestly on us, as though by our own power or holiness we had made this man to walk?



Sunday School Lessons for the Month of August

The lessons for this month were reviewed by Sister Juliette Chestang of the Church of God, Washington, DC.



LESSON 31 – August 6, 2023 SUBJECT: Forgiving One Another

GOLDEN TEXT: "Then his lord, after that he had called him, said unto him, O thou wicked servant, I forgave thee all that debt, because thou desiredst me: Shouldest not thou also have had compassion on thy fellowservant, even as I had pity on thee" (St. Matthew 18:32-33)?

PRINTED TEXT: St. Matthew 18:21 Then came Peter to him, and said, Lord, how oft shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? till seven times?

- 22 Jesus saith unto him, I say not unto thee, Until seven times: but, Until seventy times seven.
- 23 Therefore is the kingdom of heaven likened unto a certain king, which would take account of his servants.
- 24 And when he had begun to reckon, one was brought unto him, which owed him ten thousand talents.
- 25 But forasmuch as he had not to pay, his lord commanded him to be sold, and his wife, and children, and all that he had, and payment to be made.
- 26 The servant therefore fell down, and worshipped him, saying, Lord, have patience with me, and I will pay thee all.
- 27 Then the lord of that servant was moved with compassion, and loosed him, and forgave him the debt.
- 28 But the same servant went out, and found one of his fellowservants, which owed him an hundred pence: and he laid hands on him, and took him by the throat, saying, Pay me that thou owest.
- 29 And his fellowservant fell down at his feet, and besought him, saying, Have patience with me, and I will pay thee all.
- 30 And he would not: but went and cast him into prison, till he should pay the debt.
- 31 So when his fellowservants saw what was done, they were very sorry, and came and told unto their lord all that was done.
- 32 Then his lord, after that he had called him, said unto him, O thou wicked servant, I forgave thee all that debt, because thou desiredst me:
- 33 Shouldest not thou also have had compassion on thy fellowservant, even as I had pity on thee?
- 34 And his lord was wroth, and delivered him to the tormentors, till he should pay all that was due unto him.
- 35 So likewise shall my heavenly Father do also unto you, if ye from your hearts forgive not every one his brother their trespasses.

LESSON DISCUSSION

St. Matthew 18:21,22. Since these teachings seemed overwhelming to the disciples, Peter was prompted to ask: Lord how oft shall my brother sin against me (St. Matthew 18:21? Peter wrongly assumed that seven times are ample to forgive anyone. Jesus let him know that seven is not only insufficient, but that one should forgive ... Until seventy times seven (St. Matthew 18:22). In other words, unlimited forgiveness must characterize the true disciple's behavior.

In St. Matthew 18:23-35 the Parable of the unforgiving servant is used by Jesus to reinforce the power and importance of the principle of forgiveness.

A certain King represents God, the sovereign Father (See St. Matthew 18-35) to whom the debt is owed. The, one who owed him is a servant who had access to the king's money and represents the individual sinner. Ten thousand talents were an insurmountable debt equivalent to millions of dollars in our currency. This amount represents the debt of sin, which the sinner cannot pay by himself.

As Believers, let us examine our hearts. We should make certain there is no spirit of bitterness or unwillingness to forgive.

> LESSON 32 – August 13, 2023 SUBJECT: A Story of Forgiveness

GOLDEN TEXT: "For this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found. And they began to be merry" (St. Luke 15:24).

PRINTED TEXT: St. Luke 15:11 And he said, A certain man had two sons:

12 And the younger of them said to his father, Father, give me the portion of goods that falleth to me. And he divided unto them his living.

13 And not many days after the younger son gathered all together, and took his journey into a far country, and there wasted his substance with riotous living.

14 And when he had spent all, there arose a mighty famine in that land; and he began to be in want.

15 And he went and joined himself to a citizen of that country; and he sent him into his fields to feed swine.

16 And he would fain have filled his belly with the husks that the swine did eat: and no man gave unto him.

17 And when he came to himself, he said, How many hired servants of my father's have bread enough and to spare, and I perish with hunger!

18 I will arise and go to my father, and will say unto him, Father, I have sinned against heaven, and before thee,

19 And am no more worthy to be called thy son: make me as one of thy hired servants.

- 20 And he arose, and came to his father. But when he was yet a great way off, his father saw him, and had compassion, and ran, and fell on his neck, and kissed him.
- 21 And the son said unto him, Father, I have sinned against heaven, and in thy sight, and am no more worthy to be called thy son.
- 22 But the father said to his servants, Bring forth the best robe, and put it on him; and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet:
- 23 And bring hither the fatted calf, and kill it; and let us eat, and be merry:
- 24 For this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found. And they began to be merry.

LESSON DISCUSSION

The Parable of the Lost

During His earthly ministry, Jesus' teaching style frequently involved parables, simple stories used to illustrate a moral or spiritual lesson. In the St. Luke 15:11-24 parable, a man has two sons. For some strange reason, the younger son asked for his portion of the inheritance early.

The law stated in Deuteronomy 21:17 regarding inheritance rights is quite clear. If a man has two sons, upon his death, the older son is entitled to a double portion the estate. The younger son receives less.

In this parable, although the father was under no moral obligation

to give the younger son his inheritance early, he, however, did so. Consequently, the money was received and spent foolishly. The younger son traveled to a far country where he squandered the money and was left in such a desperate condition that forced him to take a job feeding swine, a despicable position for a Jewish young man.

One day, however, he came to his senses and realized how well off his father's servants fared. He came to himself and said, How many hired servants of my father's have bread enough and to spare, and I perish with hunger! I will arise and go to my father, and will say unto him, Father, I have sinned against heaven, and before thee. And no more worthy to becalled thy son: make me as one of thy hired servants (St. Luke 15:19). The father forgave and blessed him mightily.

In this parable, the father portrays our Heavenly Father in His love, kindness, grace, and mercy. If any of us needs to be reconciled to Him, we can be certain that He is waiting and watching and will never turn away from someone coming to Him.

LESSON 33 – August 20, 2023 SUBJECT: God's Gracious Rewards

GOLDEN TEXT: "And said unto them; Go ye also into the vineyard, and whatsoever is right I will give you. And they went their way" (St. Matthew 20:4).

PRINTED TEXT: St. Matthew 20:1 For the kingdom of heaven is like unto a man that is an householder, which went out early in the morning to hire labourers into his vineyard.

- 2 And when he had agreed with the labourers for a penny a day, he sent them into his vineyard.
- 3 And he went out about the third hour, and saw others standing idle in the marketplace,
- 4 And said unto them; Go ye also into the vineyard, and whatsoever is right I will give you. And they went their way.
- 5 Again he went out about the sixth and ninth hour, and did likewise.
- 6 And about the eleventh hour he went out, and found others standing idle, and saith unto them, Why stand ye here all the day idle?
- 7 They say unto him, Because no man hath hired us. He saith unto them, Go ye also into the vineyard; and whatsoever is right, that shall ye receive.
- 8 So when even was come, the lord of the vineyard saith unto his steward, Call the labourers, and give them their hire, beginning from the last unto the first.
- 9 And when they came that were hired about the eleventh hour, they received every man a penny.
- 10 But when the first came, they supposed that they should have received more; and they likewise received every man a penny.
- 11 And when they had received it, they murmured against the goodman of the house,
- 12 Saying, These last have wrought but one hour, and thou hast made them equal unto us, which have borne the burden and heat of the day.
- 13 But he answered one of them, and said, Friend, I do thee no wrong: didst not thou agree with me for a penny?
- 14 Take that thine is, and go thy way: I will give unto this last, even as unto thee.
- 15 Is it not lawful for me to do what I will with mine own? Is thine eye evil, because I am good?
- 16 So the last shall be first, and the first last: for many be called, but few chosen.

LESSON DISCUSSION

This week Jesus again engages in parable style teaching. The focus is on the labor force and their rewards. The workers who were to pick grapes did not all begin work at the same time of

day. The first shift began at about six o'clock in the morning. The second shift began around nine o'clock in the morning. Other shifts were at noon and another at three o'clock in the afternoon. Hence, there were four different shifts.

The standard wage for the work was a penny or denarius per day (See St. Matthew 20:2). In this parable, the householder is Christ. The field is the world, His church.

The first laborers began at dawn with subsequent shifts following. At the end of the day, every man was paid the same wage, causing major disgruntlement. The first hired laborers murmured because the last hired as well as the last hired laborers all received the received the same pay. Saying, These last have wrought but one hour, and thou hast made them equal unto us, which have borne the burden and heat of the day (St. Matthew 20:12). The householder had a strong word for him. Friend, I do thee no wrong: didst not thou agree with me for a penny? Take that thine is, and go thy way: I will give unto this last, even as unto thee. Is it not lawful for me to do what I will with mine own? ... So the last shall be first, and the first last: for many be called, but few chosen (St. Matthew 20:13b-16).

The first workers spoke in terms of justice, but the owner gave in terms of grace. This parable reminds the Believer that God gives according to His grace and as we will see in next week's lesson, His great mercy.

LESSON 34 – August 27, 2023 SUBJECT: God's Great Mercy

GOLDEN TEXT: "I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other: for every one that exalteth himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted" (St. Luke 18:14:).


PRINTED TEXT: St. Luke 18:9 And he spake this parable unto certain which trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and despised others:

- 10 Two men went up into the temple to pray; the one a Pharisee, and the other a publican.
- 11 The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, God, I thank thee, that I am not as other men are, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this publican.
- 12 I fast twice in the week, I give tithes of all that I possess.
- 13 And the publican, standing afar off, would not lift up so much as his eyes unto heaven, but smote upon his breast, saying, God be merciful to me a sinner.
- 14 I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other: for every one that exalteth himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted.

LESSON DISCUSSION

Jesus continues teaching by way of a parable. He began His discourse with the following statement: ... to this end, that men ought always to pray, and not to faint (St. Luke 18:1b). He explored different purposes and demonstrations in prayer by illustrating the prayers of two men who were avid church goers. According to St. Luke 18:10, Two men went up into the temple to pray; the one a Pharisee, and the other a publican. The Pharisee prayed with a boastful, haughty, prideful spirit. The publican knew he was a sinner and called out to God for mercy. Jesus said, I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other: for every one that exalteth himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted. (St. Luke 18:14)

Just as the Pharisee's outwardly pure life was no guarantee of salvation, neither is it so for any of the rest of us. It is only acknowledging our sin, repenting, asking His forgiveness that will give us eternal life.
